Minot State University's Addiction Studies Program provides the academic requirements for the North Dakota addiction counseling license. The program requirements meet the national academic standards set forth by the National Addiction Studies Accreditation Commission. For those wanting to become a licensed addiction counselor in North Dakota, in addition to their degree, graduates will need to complete 960 hours of training and pass the required licensure test. Program faculty assist students in the application process for the training. Faculty also assist students in understanding other states' and Canadian provinces' requirements for addiction counseling practice. For students interested in pursuing advanced degrees, the program provides students with a foundation to pursue graduate programs in clinical, counseling, or addiction psychology.
